Failed	On the Joint Resolution H.J.Res. 44 -- This was a vote by the Senate on a GOA-backed resolution to invalidate the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives' rule on pistol braces. Known as the Biden Pistol Ban, the Congressional Research Service estimated that the Biden Administration's rule could have outlawed as many as 40,000,000 lawfully owned, braced firearms such as AR-15s. Passed	On Passage of the Bill S. 2226 As Amended -- This was a vote on the FY 2024 National Defense Authorization Act, a funding bill that authorizes funds for the Department of Defense which Gun Owners of America opposed because it permanently reauthorized gun control, the Undetectable Firearms Act of 1988. A vote against this bill was a vote in favor of the Second Amendment. (Record Vote Number: 212) (07/27/2023).	Y	✗
Passed	On agreeing to the Kennedy Amendment -- This was a vote on S.Amdt. 1354 to S.Amdt. 1092 to H.R. 4366, otherwise known as Senator Kennedy's Amendment to stop Department of Veterans Affairs' bureaucrats from disarming an estimated 20,000 veterans per year. This GOA-backed language would eventually be signed into law. (Record Vote Number: 268) (10/25/2023).	Y	✓
Passed	On the Motion to Concur in the House Amendment to the Senate Amendment to H.R. 2882 -- This was a vote on the FY 2024 appropriations bill for several federal departments and agencies, which GOA opposed due to the inclusion of tens of millions of dollars for anti-gun "research" at the Centers for Disease Control and National Institutes of Health. GOA previously helped expose CDC and NIH for wasting millions to promote and advocate gun control—including radical new ideas like a "firearm retirement" age for confiscating guns from senior citizens. Passed	While GOA members were successful in demanding some gun control be struck from the original Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act (VAWA) proposal, anti-gun senators retained the following gun controls and inserted them into this bill: Sections 1101-1102: the NICS Denial Notification Act to launch criminal investigations into firearm transfer background check denials—even though 9 out of 10 times the system falsely denies a law-abiding citizen. Section 1103: funding for ATF to deputize local police to enforce federal gun laws, especially to undermine Second Amendment Protection Act (SAPA) states. (Recorded Vote Number: 78) (03/10/2022)	N	✓
Passed	A vote to allow consideration of compromise gun control legislation, a deal struck by Senators Cornyn and Murphy and blessed by the Senators who took this vote to proceed. (Recorded Vote Number: 235) (06/21/2022)	N	✓
Failed	A vote to allow pro-gun amendments to the Cornyn-Murphy gun control proposal, which may have allowed Gun Owners of America to attach a poison pill and prevent gun control from passing. (Recorded Vote Number: 241) (06/23/2022)	Y	✓
Passed	A motion to end debate without amendments on the Cornyn-Murphy gun control compromise including the following gun controls: Bribe states with tax dollars to impose Red Flag Gun Confiscation laws; Broaden the definition of who is a gun seller — thus increasing the number of FFLs — which becomes a backdoor way to impose Universal Background Registration Checks for almost every gun buyer; Impose federally-mandated waiting periods on certain adults before they can purchase rifles; Disarm other law-abiding adults for non-violent misdemeanors; and more.
